▲ This edition of Fearnfile has a real summer feel. There have been lots of activities over the past few weeks involving the natural world, with special mention of course to our media stars, **the ducks**.

They have made it into The Comet, but other animals seem to be heading for us as well. We had a **fox** who got caught in a goal net (thanks to the RSPCA for releasing it) and a **crow** that managed to fly into our student support centre; it was coaxed out and flew away unharmed. 


Year 7 Reward Trip




Year 8 Reward Trip





Lessons from Auschwitz

The Lessons From Auschwitz scheme gives sixth form students the opportunity to visit the notorious death camp at Auschwitz-Birkenau and meet Holocaust survivors. This is part of an educational programme to inform students about prejudice and discrimination. Nicole and Jodie took part in the scheme for Fearnhill this year and they decided to share their experiences by producing a piece of art which is on display in one of the school corridors. This has provoked some thoughtful responses from many of our students. Below you will see their work and their commentary.



They had names; they were not just a number

This artwork was produced in our follow up from our experience from the Lessons from Auschwitz Project (LFA). As part of this project we visited Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp. During our time at the seminars linked to this visit, we focused on the individuals, bystanders and perpetrators. This influenced our 'Next Steps' project as we wanted to make a statement that Auschwitz alone was not the Holocaust and there were more than 6 million victims of the Holocaust.

We would appreciate it if you could take a second to look at least one of the names behind the board. These were all real names of victims and should be remembered.

Chess Simul

We were delighted to host international chess master Paul Littlewood in the Library last week, playing against 13 students at the same time. The event is known as a Simul, where a strong player takes on numerous less experienced players at the same time.



Mr Littlewood, who holds the title for British Chess Champion 1981, took on Year 10 Luke, Year 9s Aeden, Josh B and Khalil, Year 8s Josh G and Ray and Year 7s Liam, Harriet, Holly, Ellis, Henry, Gabriel and Lewis. The students showed immense concentration as Mr Littlewood played 13 games of chess simultaneously. The final result: Mr Littlewood 13 : Students 0. However, it was a superb effort from the students and a great learning experience as Mr Littlewood answered questions from them and gave them tips on strategy and technique. Year 10 Luke won the first prize for best player at the event, followed by Year 7 Gabriel.

Former UK chess champion dukes it out with students

Schoolchildren in Leitchworth have been taking part in chess tournaments and simul, including students from Fearnhill School.

The secondary school welcomed international chess master Paul Littlewood on Friday, where he played against 13 students at the same time.

Mr Littlewood - who was British Chess Champion in 1981 - took on Year 10 Luke, Year 9s Aeden, Josh and Khalil, Year 8s Josh and Ray and Year 7s Liam, Harriet, Holly, Ellis, Henry, Gabriel and Lewis.

Librarian and learning resource manager Roshan Hunt said: "Chess is very popular at Fearnhill and in addition to those chosen to take part in the simul, we had a long reserve list of students wishing to challenge Mr Littlewood. "They have been practising hard to take him on and it is great to see our young people showing such focus and confidence. "Our students were so inspired by Mr Littlewood's last visit to our school in 2016 that we now hold our own mini simul every Friday lunchtime, with one student taking on up to six of their cohort at the same time."

One shining star from the day was Year 10 Luke Garner, who was crowned the Herefordshire Megafinal under-15 Supremo for 2018 in the Delaney UK schools challenge. "This achievement puts Luke in the top 1,000 juniors in the UK," said Mrs Hunt. "Winning means that Luke, who is a self-taught chess player, has qualified to take part in the next round in July."

On Saturday Pixmore Junior School hosted the Pixmore Open Junior Chess Tournament for the eighth year running. International master Natasha Regan and former British champion and grandmaster Matthew Sadler were on hand to give guidance to the 36 children who came along to take part.

The tournament was a joint venture between Leitchworth Chess & Go Club, Leitchworth and Hitchin Chess Club and Pixmore Junior School. Headteacher Alex Evans presented trophies and medals to winners and runners-up.






