- A happy new year to everyone welcome back! I have been struck this week on my visits to classrooms by the huge variety of exciting learning that goes on at Fearnhill every day. In just one half hour tour I met Year 7 students playing a game of grammar battleships in Spanish to learn their verb endings, another Year 7 group linking their art work to a novel, 'Kensuke's Kingdom' as a source of inspiration, Year 10 testing redox reactions using thermite, Year 8 discussing earthquakes and Year 11 learning about Elizabeth 1's court.
- In this edition, we look back at the celebrations for Christmas, including the Christmas lunch, House Day and the Christmas Bake Off winners (all of them!). We reflect on the high achieving students of the term in English and Performing Arts, and we also look forward to future events, with information on the annual A Level Art Exhibition.
