### Busy Times

Teachers are currently finalising the process for **awarding GCSE, BTEC and A Level grades** to our students and starting to plan for next year. We are also keen to welcome our new Year 7 in September, and plans for **transition activities** are well advanced. Of course we are keeping a close eye on the virus situation in case we cannot run our Transition Day as usual; we will keep everyone updated.


# Read to Succeed

The Accessit app looks like this in the Apple or Play Store. →



On 27<sup>th</sup> May Year 10 science students and their teachers were joined by researchers and lecturers from Oxford university for an interactive session on the chemistry of plastics. The researchers are working in the field of polymerisation (the process in which small molecules combine chemically to produce a very large chainlike or network molecule). Our Year 10s explored the role and benefits of research into polymer synthesis and the use of Infra-Red spectroscopy in polymer research. Not only was this a great chance for the students to deepen their knowledge and understanding of plastics it was also brilliant to meet scientists who are actually using in real life the knowledge and skills learned as part of the GCSE course. The Year 10s also had the chance to ask some undergraduates about life at one of the world's top universities and so start to have a think about what the future might hold.




