Year 11 6th Form Induction

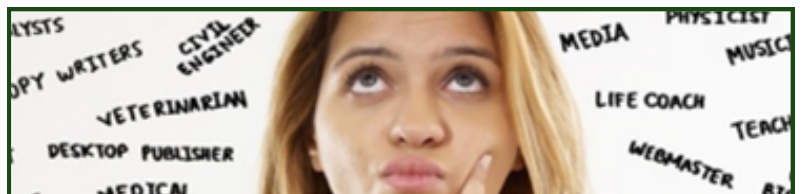

These took place at the start of June. Students hopefully used their bank of revision resources so they were fully prepared.

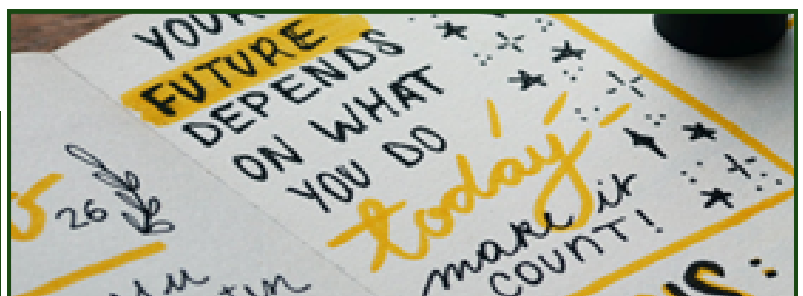
Year 13 A Level Exams

WORK EXPERIENCE REMINDER

Year 10 students should be actively contacting/asking employers in person if they can offer them work experience...

Well done to those of you who have already obtained a placement and started the process on Unifrog. Others need to be braver and physically go in to work places and ask if they offer work experience. It's a good idea to practice what you want to say beforehand and have your contact details to hand. Conversing with complete strangers is a scary prospect but the Alumni event has proved that you are able to do this and it will be an expectation in the real world to source your own work and make it happen. You'll be surprised at just how easy it is once you begin the conversation.

The PowerPoint shown to students is here.

Please can I encourage you to read through this PowerPoint as it is imperative that the placement and employer details, once sourced, are uploaded to Unifrog by students/parents/carers. There is also a parent/carer page which you have to complete. Failure to complete these sections will mean that students cannot go out due to safeguarding reasons.



Students must source their own placement and the **deadline for this is Monday 1st June (straight after half term).**

Emails will be sent throughout the process and we will support you where required. Please be sure to read all correspondence sent and Careerfile where all information can also be found.

Can I also take this opportunity to thank you in advance for your support in ensuring that your child finds a placement. This is a fantastic opportunity for students to shine and gain the experience that can be added to their CV which will serve to enhance their future prospects.



Step 1: contact employers via email or letter

Even if you know the employer personally, you should contact them in writing, using formal language.

You need to include:

- The **dates** of your work experience
- **Why** you would like to complete your work experience at this organisation
- What you can **offer** them

Top tip:

Get someone to proofread your letter/email to help check for typos or any errors.



Why do this?

This will help you practise writing real job applications. It also sets a professional tone for your placement.

HOW DO YOU ORGANISE WORK EXPERIENCE?



Step 2: complete the Placement form on Unifrog

Once an employer accepts your application, log onto Unifrog and complete the Student initial form on the Placements tool.

You can find the Placements tool at the bottom of the page when you log in.

What if you don't get offered a place?

Don't panic! Keep applying, and try out new employers. If an employer isn't replying to you, try giving them a polite phone call.

If you need help, please ask:

Ms Balchin/Ms Charter/your form tutor

The most popular placements get taken up first, so don't hang around!

Step 3: get the placement confirmed

- The employer will automatically get an email asking them to complete an online form.
- Your parent/carer will also receive an email for them to agree to your placement.
- The emails will be from Unifrog who use the email address: noreply@unifrog.org.



Top tip:

If your employer or parent/carer hasn't got the email, get them to check their junk/spam folder.

If they're still having trouble, they should get in touch with **Ms Charter** who will be able to help.



Step 4: get the placement approved

- **Ms Balchin** and **Ms Charter** will look over your placement and make sure everything is good to go.
- Once they've approved your placement, Unifrog will send a confirmation email to you, your employer, your parent/carer, and Ms Charter.

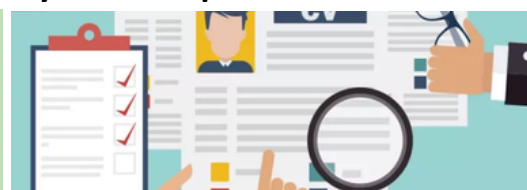

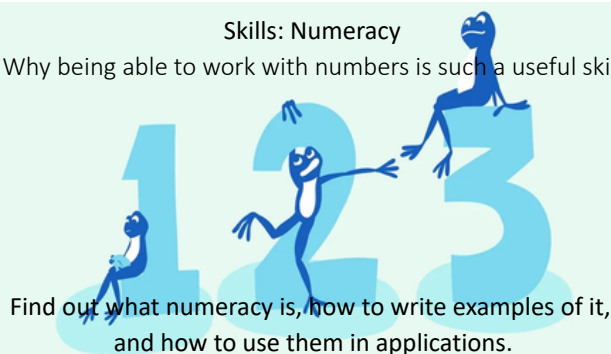

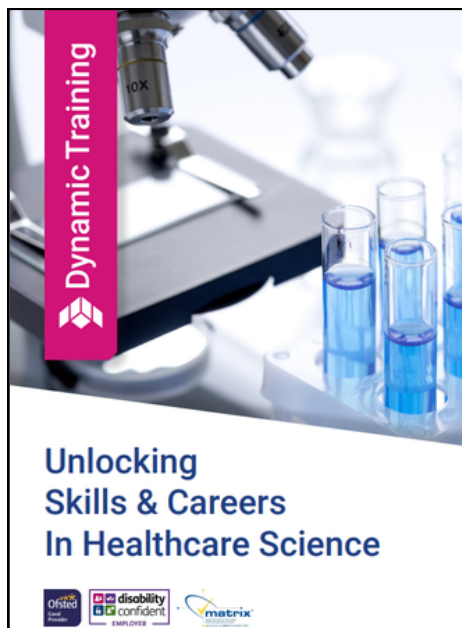
